Questions for Further Reflection

1. Read Hebrews 12:4-13. Take your time. What stands out to you as you read these texts? Anything about these verses that takes you by surprise?
2. How does the concept of correction, as described in the sermon, challenge or align with your own experiences of being corrected in your spiritual life? Can you think of a time when someone corrected you in love, and how did it impact your growth as a believer?
3. The sermon makes a distinction between correction that leads to Christ-likeness versus correction that enforces someone else's moral code. How can we discern the difference, and how should we respond to both?
4. The message emphasizes humility in receiving correction. How can we develop a heart that welcomes correction, even when it feels uncomfortable or challenging?
5. The story of the husband guiding his blind wife at the end of the sermon illustrates gentle and supportive correction. How can this image shape the way we correct others?
