## **Questions for Further Reflection**

- 1. Read Colossians 3:1-13. What stands out to you as you read these texts? Anything about these verses that takes you by surprise?

- 3. What are some ways the church can demonstrate grace to individuals who are struggling with visible sins or behaviors that might be viewed as inconsistent with scripture?
